GENERAL INFORMATION

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water posed a health risk. SOURCE WATER ASSESSMENT INFORMATION

The Eagle Grove Water Supply obtains its water from the Mississippian & Pleistocene Buried Sand & Gravel aquifers. The Mississippian aquifer was determined to have low susceptibility to contamination because the characteristics of the aquifer and overlying materials provide natural protection from contaminants at the land surface. The Mississippian well will have low susceptibility to surface contaminants such as leaking underground storage tanks, contaminant spills and excess fertilizer application.

The Pleistocene Buried Sand & Gravel aquifer was determined to be slightly susceptible to contamination because the characteristics of the aquifer and overlying materials provide moderate protection from contaminants at the land surface. The Pleistocene Buried Sand & Gravel wells will be slightly susceptible to surface contaminants such as leaking underground storage tanks, contaminant spills and excess fertilizer application.
