Wood moved, Weber seconded approval of Iowa Governmental Health Care Plan (IGHCP) insurance renewals (health, dental, life and voluntary vision) for fiscal year 2027 as presented. All ayes and motion carried.

Weber moved, Wood seconded approval to set time / date / place for FY 2027 Keokuk County budget public hearing as April 6, 2026, at 9:00 a.m. - Boardroom – 1st floor of Keokuk County Courthouse. All ayes and motion carried.

Wood moved, Weber seconded approval of participant form for Keokuk County to participate in the new National Opioids Six Remnant Defendants Settlement as submitted. All ayes and motion carried.

Weber moved, Wood seconded to adopt the resolution amending Keokuk County Sheriff's FY27 salary increase approved on January 5, 2026, from 3% (\$2,966) to a flat \$10,000 to comply with Back to Blue requirements of Iowa Code 331.907 as submitted. Sheriff Hinah requested additional compensation, that was followed up with the Iowa Attorney General (AG) opinion, that the sheriff's salary should be increased to correlate with the comparisons as noted in code. Also present were Conservation Director Reighard, Treasurer Long, Emergency Management/911 Coordinator Fortney and Aaron Kephart.

Various Board and Committee reports were held. Wood attended monthly RUSS and 1015 Transit meetings. Weber attended Early Childhood and Keokuk County Economic Development (KCED) meetings. Discussion of old/new business and public comment was held. De-Jong Lawn & Landscape, Inc. sent an estimate of \$960 to care for the Courtyard lawn. Board consensus was to approve said service. Keokuk County employees will receive notice today regarding the upcoming increase of an additional health insurance deduction of \$10 per month to address increasing premiums and high claims in a step increase manner so it is not a financial burden to employees.

On vote and motion Hadley adjourned the meeting at 9:45 a.m.
